UT Gardens-Crossville, affectionately referred to as the Plateau Discovery Gardens, is located within the University of Tennessee Plateau AgResearch and Education Center on 70N. This parcel of land beside the main building has grown to become a demonstration garden designed for visitors and residents of the Plateau, and more specifically, Cumberland County.

It is a collaborative effort between UT Plateau AgResearch and Education Center, UT Extension-Cumberland County, and the Cumberland County Master Gardener Association.

Open: Daylight hours, 365 days of the year; no admission fee.

Over 40 classes are typically scheduled at the Discovery Gardens on a wide variety of horticultural, nature, landscaping and gardening topics. Most classes are free, but all require reservations.
