The Master Gardener Panel in October was a huge success! They answered so many great questions and emphasized that with the lack of rain in the late summer months many of our trees and plants were going dormant earlier than usual as a measure of preservation. Because of this, fall is not a good time to trim except for branches that are obviously dead. Wait until spring!

There were many questions regarding Hydrangeas, trimming, and why they might not be blooming. In many cases these plants do not need trimmed – and any trimming should be done before the plant sets new blooms in late winter or early spring. Most varieties need at least 4 hours of sunlight. Some varieties need a number of years to mature. Buds can be killed with a cold winter. And yes, our deer WILL eat the blooms!

Join us on November 20<sup>th</sup> to hear all about Bees. Sheila Ray will be able to help us understand how to continue to help our bee population.
