

Do you know what Mycelium is?

Mycelium, or mycorrysis, is a fungus that expands underground, creating a network of connections between all plant species, something like the Internet, which allows them not only to communicate, but also to take care of themselves, protect themselves, feed themselves and stock up on the water.

When a tree in the forest is cut down, this mycelium communicates to many trees in the forest that one of them is dying and all the other trees through the mycelium begin to care for the remaining trunk to try to save that life. They feed it with water and protect it because that dying trunk is part of the forest family. Everything has a language. It is the universal language.

We learn to reconnect with this non-verbal language, understanding that we are all part of the same thing.

We still have a lot to learn from our older brothers, from the trees and the forest and above all from Our Mother Earth.

Come and help us to plant a meadow!

The Friends of **Cumberland Mtn State Park (**FCMSP) have been purchasing and planting many shrubs and trees near the start of the ADA trail at Cumberland Mtn State Park with grant money from the state's Iris Fund. We will need volunteers in the first two weeks of December (dates to be announced later) to install 3,800 plant plugs! We will remove the 6 big tarps you see there now late November and wait for a good rain, hopefully within two weeks in December. Then we will get the exact date out to those who signed up to volunteer to plant. If you want to help us plant this meadow, text Secretary Laurie Snyder 615-969-7612 with your contact phone number or email address so she can let you know the date. There will also be a signup sheet at the September FGGC member meeting at the park September 18th and an optional training Saturday October 19th at 1pm at Shelter One at the park.

Last year we had drought in November and December! So, we hope for rain in early December this year to let the plugs get a good start. We have had to hand water the 50 bushes and trees we planted already due to the dry spells! Hopefully we won't need to do that for all these plugs.

We received a large grant from the state Iris Fund for this project. When you buy a Tennessee license plate, with the native dwarf crested iris flower on it, a portion of the money goes to Tn State Parks for grants to improve the parks. You can do this through our local county clerk's office when you renew your auto license. We encourage you to do that!

All the plants are required to be native not only to Tennessee but to Cumberland County and will provide host plants and food for pollinators like the Monarch Butterflies! 19 varieties have been selected like common milkweed. Indian Pink at the Aviary is in the picture above. Planting native plants has several advantages because they are adapted to our climate and already have resistance to local diseases.


We look forward to some of you joining us to plant a beautiful flower garden at the start of the ADA trail in December.
