

Just a reminder our annual Fern & Geranium sale is right around the corner. This is our largest fundraising event of the year. All proceeds go to the CCHS Greenhouse Maintenance Program and the FGGC Helena Schmidt Scholarship Fund which grants college scholarships to local students in the Crossville area. The CCHS students grow these plants as part of their curriculum and are graded on them.

We cannot do this fundraising event without the help of our volunteers. As a volunteer your responsibility is to:

- help the customer pick out their plant(s), and bring to payment table (you will not be responsible to collect money)
- help carry the plant(s) to the customers car
- re-arrange plants as needed to keep the area stocked and at the mall keep the floors swept and clean






#### The Conservation Committee




### **Monthly Speaker Information**

#### Like the colors of a rainbow, hummingbirds have pizazz

Our hummingbirds are returning. There are over 330 hummingbird species but they are only found in the New World. They may be small but they are colorful. These vibrant flower-loving pixies occur in a wider range of colors than all other bird species combined. Purple, yellow, green, crimson, blue, like the colors of a rainbow. Wow! The wintertime Rufous Hummingbird is even bathed in UT Orange. Yet, the Ruby-throated is our most familiar summertime hummer.


Stephen Lyn Bales is a naturalist and author from Knoxville. He has written three books all published by the University of Tennessee Press.
